What a year it has been so far...I can't believe we are halfway through it already. Time really flies when you're having fun ;)






Phlebotomy and IV Luer Skills: Cindy Fang and Lisa Ye

Cindy Fang, Lisa Ye, and Sagern Naidoo provided an overview of modern wound management practices, emphasizing proper care to promote optimal wound healing.






POST-CONFERENCE CELEBRATIONS

























YACMA BOARDGAMES NIGHT
