




Carol Huang - Editor



Warm welcome to the "Year of the Rabbit" and thank you for all ACMA/YACMA members' continued support and participation for our CME events.



This event was kindly sponsored by Waitemata Endoscopy









On 8th April, the YACMA family kicked off the year with our much anticipated event of Yumcha at Sunworld, Newmarket.



We are always thankful for MAS' continued support to not only make this amazing event possible, but also supporting our medical cohort in every aspect.


