Dear ACMA Members,





Wow is it the end of 2024 already!! Semester 1 seemed like only yesterday!




等 JULY CME



ACMA ELECTIVE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

The recipient of the 2024 ACMA Elective scholarship is Michel Luo, who held is elective in Rarotonga. Here are his thoughts on the elective:

Te Marae Ora is the hospital within Rarotonga. It consists of several key specialties, with my time being focused within OBGYN and General Medicine. Throughout the time, I had the opportunity to cement information learned from my rotations back in NZ and apply that clinical knowledge over in a less advantaged country. While the staffing is adequate to cover the amount of patients there, spare hands are always welcomed, especially when we can offer a break for the clinicians who are often working on call 24/7, 365 days a year. The population of Rarotonga are majority English speaking, but still hold Cook Island culture dearly, however compared to the previous generations, this is slowly changing, with more younger generations adopting a western lifestyle, as evident in the change in food, a vital part of culture. The other part of my elective was held at LabPlus, at the mortuary. The specialty itself is quite niche, being separate from Anatomical Pathology (which deals with diagnosing specimens sent to the lab). It is quite refreshing to review skills and knowledge that often have been pushed aside since our pre-clinical years. These included performing dissections on deceased patients, and then examining the histological slides, ultimately to answer a clinical question, whether that may be related to a homicide, confirming a diagnosis, or providing answers to the family of the deceased.



The YACMA AGM celebrated a highly productive and engaging year for our association over a sumptuous dinner at Cafe BBQ Duck. In 2024, YACMA achieved record sign-ups, with 99 new members. Our events, including the ever-popular yum cha social, the winter social, and our mentorship initiatives, were met with overwhelming enthusiasm and participation.



In Loving Memory: Dr. Mervyn Joseph Ah Chan


22 January 1945 - 8 December 2024

Auckland Chinese Medical association would like to acknowledge and remember the life of ACMA GP member Dr Mervyn Ah Chan who passed away recently. He was a much loved father, brother, uncle and kung kung. He was a dedicated doctor to his patients and a loyal friend to ACMA. He was also a keen cook of crayfish and smoked goods and an endurance swimmer. Mervyn was born in 1945 and attended Otago medical school. He practiced medicine for over forty years during what he considered the "golden years of general practice" as a solo GP in West Auckland. He considered his patients as family and in some cases looked after three generations. In those early days of house calls maternity care, 24hr on call and no computers not faced by doctors of today. He was a founding member of ACMA and enjoyed CME meetings so he could catch up with colleagues. He shared his boundless humour and optimism. He also served as ACMA Vice President. Ever loyal to the end, he would ask any Asian doctor he came across in hospital if they were ACMA members and try and recruit them to the cause. He retired in his 70s to devote more time to his family and garden. He was in good health until the last few months. He passed away in hospital after a short illness on 8 th December, aged 79.
