

Brian has a strong interest in research. He completed a Bachelor of Medical Science (Hons) in 2017.






#### Tianwei Liu - CHAINZ Webmaster


#### Sophie Yu - Webmaster

### YACMA SCHOLARSHIP

William Xu was awarded the ACMA Elective Scholarship to complete a combined research-clinical elective at Northland DHB under the supervision of A/Prof Christopher Harmston.

His project was to complete a population-based cohort study using Ministry of Health data in combination with the New Zealand Cancer Registry data and characterize the reasons for readmission after colorectal cancer surgery.

Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer in Aotearoa New Zealand and its incidence is high by international standards. Although colorectal cancer is rarer in Asian populations compared to Europeans, case numbers are likely to increase as the Asian population of NZ grows to a projected 20% by 2030. Readmission rates are high after surgery, but local NZ data is lacking. The aim of the project is to determine clinical drivers of readmission.

The study included 16,885 patients discharged from hospital after primary colorectal cancer resection. It found that readmissions following colorectal resections remain challenging to predict but occur frequently. While patient comorbidities and postoperative complications were associated with readmission, the explanatory value of these variables is poor. The study concluded that in order to reduce unplanned readmissions, efforts should be focused on prevention and early detection of post-discharge complications. This paper is currently being prepared for peer-reviewed publication.

According to William, this elective was critical to helping him take steps towards a career in academic surgery. It gave him an opportunity to travel away from Auckland where he grew up to develop his clinical skills. Furthermore, it allowed him an opportunity to work with some of the leading clinicians in this area in New Zealand. He expresses his gratitude for the generosity of ACMA for supporting his work.


