


YACMA is continuing to work closely with ACMA, with preparation for the ACMA conference well underway. A big thank you to ACMA for their continued and generous support.







2023 YACMA AGM





DINNER AT THE TREASURE KITCHEN



O-WEEK ACTIVITIES


New semester, new faces, new YACMA adventures! We kicked off the year with exciting events to welcome both new and returning students.






